Ordinance No. 238

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING IT A NUISANCE TO
HARBOR CERTAIN LIVESTOCK WITHIN THE
CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE VILLAGE OF THORNVILLE

Be it ordained by the Council of the Village of Thornville, Perry County, Ohio:

Section 1. Unless special permission is first obtained from the Council of the Village of Thornville, no person shall harbor, maintain or keep horses, ponies, cattle, sheep, mules, goats or other farm animals or livestock of similar nature within the corporate limits of the Village of Thornville.

Section 2. Upon complaint being made, the Mayor is authorized and directed to notify the owner or keeper of such livestock to abate such nuisance and to remove said livestock or farm animals within thirty (30) days after being notified thereof.

Section 3. Whoever violates the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined not more than Ten Dollars (\$10.00) for the first month's violation after being notified under the provisions of Section 2 above and not more than Five Dollars (\$5.00) per day for continued violation thereafter.

Section 4. This ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the Village and its inhabitants and for the further reason that the immediate regulation of farm animals and livestock within the corporate limits of the Village of Thornville is necessary to control odors and animal waste offensive to the health and well being of the inhabitants of the Village.
