

ORDINANCE NO. 22-05

ADOPTED May 23 2022

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 21-14 (THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATION ORDINANCE), THEREBY REVISING SUMS FOR OPERATING EXPENSES AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village of Thornville is authorized to adopt the Municipal Budget for the fiscal year beginning January 1, 2022 and ending December 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, with Ordinance 21-14, adopted on December 13, 2021, Council for the Village of Thornville established the Village's annual appropriations for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Fiscal Officer has recommended amending the appropriations to supplement those appropriations previous adopted by Council.

NOW, **THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED** by the Council of the Village of Thornville, County of Perry, State of Ohio:

SECTION 1: The 2022 Annual Appropriation of the Village of Thornville, as established by Ordinance 21-14, shall hereby be amended and additional amounts shall be appropriated, as recommended by the Fiscal Officer, as follows:

SECTION 2: All other original and amended sections and sub-sections of Ordinance 21-14 shall remain unchanged, in effect, and enforceable.

SECTION 3: It is hereby found and determined that all formal action of this Council concerning and relating to the passage of this Ordinance were adopted in open meeting of this Council, and that any and all deliberation of this Council and any of its committee that results in such formal action were in meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements of the laws of the State of Ohio.

SECTION 4: All prior legislation, or any parts thereof, which is/are inconsistent with this Ordinance is/are hereby repealed as to the inconsistent parts thereof.

SECTION 5: This Ordinance is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the health, safety and welfare of the residents of Thornville and the further reason that Council needs to provide the necessary funds to meet requirements and obligations. Wherefore, provided this Ordinance receives the required affirmative votes of Council, this Ordinance shall take effect and be in force immediately upon passage by Council.
